

#### "Dwelling Together in Unity"

(Excerpts from the Sermon on Sunday, September 23)

NIV Psalm 133 A song of ascents. Of David.

1 How good and pleasant it is when brothers live together in unity!
2 It is like precious oil poured on the head, running down on the beard, running down on Aaron's beard, down upon the collar of his robes.
3 It is as if the dew of Hermon were falling on Mount Zion. For there the LORD bestows his blessing, even life forevermore.

"Sweetheart, I don't feel like going to church this morning."

"I'm tired, the people don't like me, and the sermons are boring. Give me four reasons why I should go to church this morning."

- "You will feel better once you get up and start moving."
- "The people there really do like you."
- "The sermons aren't that bad."
- "And most important. YOU'RE THE PASTOR!"

We laugh at this story because sometimes we don't feel motivated to go to church. But usually once we go we're glad we did as we connect with God and with one another! Now I've heard some people say over the years, "I'm a spiritual person. I don't need organized religion, after all I can worship God anywhere." The problem with that kind of thinking is that you can't build relationships with people without spending time with them and getting to know them. God has designed us to live in community! When we worship God together and get to know one another as we live in community our lives are enriched!

Yvonne Wang brought some flowers over to Penny a few weeks ago when she was laid up at home recovering from her knee replacement surgery and we went out to lunch. Yvonne Wang is from China and about eighteen months ago relocated with her family to Irvine. She shared that the underground church she attended in China, known as a house church, had around 30 members.



### Missions' Corner

Rev. Ernanie C. Castillo, a beloved Filipino missionary and pastor, passed away this summer. Below is a letter from the family about Nannie's life.

Rev. Ernanie C. Castillo passed away at home on July 10, 2018. The morning before he passed, we thought he was dreaming. We found out that he was actually praying intensely for family, the ministry, and his vision.

Born in a sugarcane planting province, Negros Island, Philippines, and raised during World War 2, "Nannie" was toughened by his personal circumstances. As a child, he dug sidewalk drainages and sewers, and he carried sugarcane refuse onto train cars just to uplift his family's finances. "Nannie" attended Bible College, and it was a "no turning back" Christian commitment for him from then on. He served churches despite hard times and financially challenging situations. During his early married life, Nannie and his wife experienced times when they only had bananas and harvested mushrooms to eat.

"Nannie" was led to start the Congregational Way in the Philippines, and National Association of Congregational Churches (NACC) was born in 1991. With the NACC, "Nannie" found great joy directly alleviating the plight of those who were experiencing the same financial hardships he had experienced years back. NACC also allowed him the privilege of seeing hundreds of students receive scholarships for continuing education.



The late Rev. Dr. Ernanie C. Castillo dreamed of and began building an income-generating, people-employing, and church-edifying CAMP SITE. The Vine and Branches Camp Site now has quality structures built on fully purchased land located in a tourist city (Tagaytay City). Awit, Nannie's surviving wife and co-founding leader of the NACC, decided that donations received towards the family/Nannie's funeral will be allotted to The Vine and Branches Camp Site and Christian

Venue Center. Nannie had always believed Psalm 18:25: "FAITH HONORS GOD AND GOD HONORS FAITH." By faith, we carry on Nannie's desire and may God be honored and honor our Mission's vision.
