#### "Gratitude and Wholeness"

From a Roman prison the Apostle Paul writes these reassuring words to the believers in Philippi, "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything with prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, shall guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus." Philippians 4:6-8

What does this text tell us about gratitude? And how does gratitude relate to wholeness?

I believe that the first step toward being a grateful person is to open our eyes to the world around us - to the sights and tastes, the smells and sounds. Gratefulness comes by being aware of the miracle of life which surrounds us.

If you want to gain insights into the wonder of life spend some time with little children. They are like a new digital camera snapping pictures of everything all around them. Life is full of wonder, excitement, and fun.

A flower needs to be picked and explored. A glass of milk has to be felt. Spaghetti has to be sucked or played with. Caterpillars need to be picked up and put up on your arm because they tickle when they walk. Puddles were made to step in because of the splash they make. And a light rain on a child's face can make her giggle.

Curiosity and wonder reign in a child's life.

To live life with a spirit of gratitude is possible if like children we pay attention to the wonder of life all around us. Don't take for granted the simple things in life: laughing with some good friends, feeling the sun on your face and the wind at your back, playing a game of tennis, basketball or chess, biting into a tasty homemade cookie. These are some of the everyday miracles we can be thankful for.
