

Our teacher staff is mostly made out of our graduates, or even, our graduates' children like Ivan.

Ivan Morales (21 years old) is studying to become an Industrial Engineer at one of the most recognized

Universities in Tijuana and in the mornings he teaches the English class to our second year students. He volunteers his time to give back to the community.

UNIFORM

\$75 for 1 set (P.E. and formal attire)
\$30 for school shoes
\$30 for tennis shoes



SCHOOL SUPPLIES

\$480 per year to purchase school supplies for 12 subjects. Includes monthly replacement of supplies and ribbons for typing classes, paper and toner for printing in computer classes and other subjects' homework.

MEALS

With an average of 20 days of classes per month and our school schedule being from 7:30am until 4:30pm our kids need proper nourishment.

- \$20 per month or \$200 per year to provide daily breakfast at \$1 each day.
- \$40 per month or \$400 per year to provide daily breakfast and lunch at \$2 each day.
- \$5 per month or \$50 per year to provide a fruit snack at \$0.25 each day.

\$30 per month or \$300 per year.




