

Griffith House Beginnings

We have been busy preparing for the Griffith House Anniversary Celebration that will be held at the beginning of the month! A 1920s themed open house will be held on Saturday, September 7th from 2:00-4:30pm to celebrate and share the rich history of the Spanish style home that began the life of our church! There will be appetizers, Model T cars, and a fabulous band organized by Isy Martin, Jr. Marlen Landin, vocalist, and Reinhold Schwarzwald, sax and vocals, will perform with Isy on the lawn. See the inserted flyer for more information about these incredible musicians!

As you step into the Griffith House at the event, I invite you to appreciate the slides, videos and documents that tell the story of the home. I was amazed to learn that the high beams in the chapel are completely original—used first as a living room. Notice the garage photos, now our church office, that the Griffith boys originally used to build sail boats! Did you know that there was a specific meaning associated with the blue trim around the original windows? I'll let you search the history or ask helpers at the event to find the answer. It's fascinating!

I would love to introduce you to an incredible woman—Mrs. Caroline Southwick Plumb Griffith. Mrs. Griffith and her family moved into the Griffith House in 1927 and oversaw eight acres of orange groves that surrounded the home. In 1957, Mrs. Griffith and her sons gifted their home to four trustees, all ministers, for the purpose of planting a Congregational church in Anaheim. Disneyland had just come to town, and property in Anaheim was in high demand. A realtor commented, "This land is too valuable to be used for a church!" Why would Mrs. Griffith choose to donate 2 1/2 acres of prime land to begin a Congregational church? Mrs. Griffith wrote a beautiful letter explaining the history that shaped her own heart and faith. The following are excerpts from her letter.

"My grandfather was responsible for my being a Congregationalist—Abidjan Southwick had a station in the Underground Railway. His farm was near Ashtabula, Ohio. He had an old two-seated carriage with side curtains that he used when taking the escaping slaves from his barn to the harbor when he learned that a boat from Canada was coming in—one that was a part of the line.



(Griffith House Beginnings Continued...)

"In those days women wore large shawls and when grandmother walked out the back door down a slope and into the hayloft of the barn, hidden under her shawl was food which she dropped into the stalls below after lifting a loosened board. I have one of her shawls and I like to think that many a fresh loaf from her oven was hidden under its folds and dropped to those hungry and frightened human beings. Mother was the youngest of five children in the Southwick family. But helping escaping slaves had been a part of the family living for so many years that she was born into the pattern and does not remember ever being cautioned not to mention it. Had grandfather been caught, he would have lost his property.

"Abidjan and Roxanna were not happy in their church because it would not take a stand against slavery. So grandfather and some friends organized a Congregational Church [that would take a stand against slavery] ...

"Growing up in a Congregational Church, and I hope I am still growing up, helped to broaden me mentally and spiritually. But freedom imposes responsibility. And I suppose that, and wishing others could find the same help. In living is the answer to the question that was put to me the other day— 'Why do you and your sons wish to give your home for a Congregational Church?'"

Mrs. Griffith lived a simple faith: Love God and neighbor. Known as the "sandwich lady," Mrs. Griffith regularly prepared sandwiches and brought them to the tubercular ward of the Orange County Hospital. She did the same for the homeless who found shelter under a bridge on the Santa Ana River.

"But freedom imposes responsibility." This phrase has echoed in my mind since I first read Mrs. Griffith's letter months ago. Just as Mrs. Griffith's choices may be understood by her history, I believe our church will be enriched by reflecting on our beginning. The freedom that comes from our faith in Christ presents us with responsibility. I have noticed that deep love for missions and a posture of generosity flow throughout the history of the church. May this celebration nurture our gratitude for the freedom we have in Christ and energize us to continue to use this freedom for the love of our neighbor.
