#### The Importance of Connection

This year, I have grown to value relationship and connection more than ever. Relationships provide support and safe space to be vulnerable. Adventures and new experiences come to life in the company of those we love. Relationships spark new ideas and inspire us as we share and hear from one another.

I have been amazed to watch human creativity and resourcefulness at work as we found new ways to connect even in the midst of a pandemic. It was fun to see how the Orange circle adjusted to new needs—traffic was blocked off and restaurants set up tables and umbrellas in the street. It was such a great solution that allowed the community to continue to come together and support local businesses!

Within our church, we have been able to connect in new ways as well. Now that location is not a barrier, church members who moved out of state and family members who live far away are able to join us in worship or in small groups. Those who have not been able to drive to attend small groups are now able to participate via Zoom from home. Linda Freud has connected with the children in the church—sending creative Sunday School packets with lessons and activities. We have even been able to hear from Missionaries via live interviews online. COVID-19 threatened our ability to connect, but in some ways COVID-19 has opened up new possibilities to connect.

Ephesians 4 talks about the body of Christ and our role in connection with one another. We each have unique God-given gifts that are meant to be used. We come to life and grow as we use our gifts. The church grows in maturity when all authentically participate in community. We need to be connected to one another in order to grow and thrive.

#### Pastor's Letter Continued...

The importance of connection has been highlighted this year, and so has the pain of disconnection. Respectful conversation and listening among people with different perspectives can be challenging, especially in an election year. Positions are sometimes announced in ways that project shame and blame instead of inviting dialogue. Ephesians reminds us that we need each other in the Body of Christ. Our goal is to be equipped for works of service, to be united in faith and to become mature in Christ.

As Christians, I wonder how our conversations may shift if we focus on shared goals and shared values. We all want to love God with our whole heart, soul, mind and strength. We are working to love our neighbor as ourselves. We value justice and empowering those who have been oppressed, because God values justice and abundant life for all. Our methods of engagement and our ideas about potential solutions will not be the same. My hope is that in the middle of challenging conversations, we will try to see our neighbor as God sees our neighbor. I hope that we will remember that each person is uniquely gifted and that each person's role in the Body of Christ is valuable. Iron sharpens iron, and different perspectives that create tension can actually be productive when handled with respect and grace. I hope we will grow as people who can create safe space for questions and honest, respectful dialogue—because in that kind of space, we all grow in maturity as the Body of Christ. I wonder how tough conversations would be transformed if we entered them asking: "What are our common goals and how do you think we can get there?"

I thank God for this church community and the connections that have been growing among us. We are starting small groups again via Zoom the week of September 21st—all are welcome to join us! We will read and discuss the second half of "Jesus Called: He Wants His Church Back" by Ray Johnston. I will facilitate a Tuesday evening group from 6:00-7:15pm and Pastor Jim will facilitate a Thursday evening group from 7:00-8:15pm. I pray that we will continue to grow in strength and maturity through authentic conversations and connection. I pray that our growth will overflow in active love for our neighbors.
