Pastor's Letter

During worship on Sunday, June 13th, we are looking forward to formally welcoming some new members to our church family! We have been meeting with individuals interested in joining the church recently to explain what it means that we are a Congregational church. This is a great opportunity for all of us to learn a little bit more about our roots as a Congregational church.

Congregational churches are fully autonomous churches under the headship of Jesus Christ. This means that there is no outside hierarchy that tells a local church how to organize itself or how to respond to challenges. The local church is complete in and of itself and the congregation listens for the leading of the Holy Spirit as they seek to follow the way of Jesus Christ together. Therefore, each Congregational church can look very unique—shaped by the culture, the gifts and the leading of God among the people that make up the local church.

Congregational churches value the autonomy of the local church, and they also value the importance of Christian relationship beyond each individual church's walls. There are different congregational associations of churches that exist in the United States and in the world. We are part of the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches (NACCC), and we are part of the International Congregational Fellowship (ICF). The National Office for the NACCC provides resources and encourages connection between the various churches, regional associations and supported missions. As part of our membership in the NACCC, we also participate in the Cal-West Association. This group includes Congregational churches in Southern California and Arizona as well as additional churches in surrounding states.

ission Ministries Phil. was founded because of its calling to give quality education to the least privileged children in poor communities and most importantly to spread the Good News of salvation.



Every year, we see to it that we do a culminating activity that will lead every child to a pathway of kidpreneurship. We do a "Palengke Like This Program" which before was called "Munting Palengke sa Loob ng Paaralan" until such time that we moved out to a covered court near the school.

advertise their products online. They were also asked to be part of the preparations and even selling of such.

This then had become a motivating gem to the young minds. Some of the children's reactions are:

- "It's enjoying, I was able to share my clothes with others" because they did an ukay-ukay thing. Actually, there were two of them who did such.
- "Happy... because I have money to buy a speaker" and he encouraged his Mom to continue selling.
- "Happy..." because of the experience of selling and earning money out of it.

There's the spirit of sharing, a plan where to use the money, and the joy of knowing that there's a good fruit out of it.

Such kinds of experiences won't be forgotten.
