Being a Christian and Being a Patriotic Citizen

As we approach the 4th of July I've been giving extra thought to what it means to be a person of faith AND a responsible citizen of our beloved country, the United States of America.

This country is the place of our earthly home. A place most of us, or our ancestors, immigrated to, seeking a safe place to build lives and families. Our relationships, struggles and joys have happened here. In school we were taught some of our country's history and values and we may have family members who have given much of themselves in public or military service. All of these things should help us love this country and motivate us to live as good citizens. But we are also people of faith who believe there is a God who created all people everywhere and who cares not just for the USA, but for everyone in every country. Our first allegiance is to God and to spreading the kingdom of God. Jesus, in the story of the woman at the well, emphasized that what God cares about is not what group we belong to but that we worship in spirit and truth. Paul wrote in his letter to the Philippian Christians that our citizenship is in heaven, not on earth.

Patriotism can take many forms. It can be expressed in a form of humble gratitude, recognizing we get to live in this place and want to help it live up to it's stated values or it can be expressed in a form that basically says, "I'm better than you and can do whatever I damn well please!" As Christians who love this country and want to be good citizens in it, we should aim, I believe, to filter our concepts of "Good Citizenship" through the lens of what we have been given through Christ.

Such values are:

Love God with all your heart, soul and mind and your neighbor as yourself.

Do justice, love mercy and walk humbly with your God.

By grace you have been saved.

Missions Corner

The National Association of Congregational Christian Churches highlighted two of the missions we support in the June *Congregationalist* magazine. Here are the most recent updates from Christ to the Villages in Nigeria and the Congregational Church of Myanmar.

CHRIST TO THE VILLAGES, NIGERIA

Pastor Matthew Oladele asks that you pray for wisdom for the leadership of this ministry, safety from all danger and political instability, provision to meet the needs of the mission, divine grace, direction, and divine provisions. Please pray for our faithful staff and that churches will grow in the Lord and all good works. Give thanks to God for the work He is using Christ to the Villages to perform in Nigeria and for all our partners and

supporters, God's blessings on

them.

The mission has several needs: ◆ A high lumen portable projector that can be used during daytime presentations ◆ Laptop computers ◆ Restroom for Alpha Elementary School Shao ◆ Restroom for Omega High School Shao ◆ Missionary children sponsors ◆ An off-road vehicle (the present one is wearing out and much is being spent on maintenance)



Pastor Matthew, pictured on the left and above with his wife, began a cashew farm to create sustainable income for Christ to the Villages. How much have the cashew trees grown? Well, they are about as tall as Pastor Matthew -6'

The Christ to the Villages Mission ministers to hundreds of persons in the remote villages of central Nigeria. Rev. Solomon Oladele, founder of the mission, was born into an animist family. A group of Missionaries preaching the Gospel message convinced Solomon to become a Christian. Persecuted by both his family and Muslim leaders, he continued in the faith and later answered the Lord's call into full-time ministry. Upon his

death, his son, Matthew, became the mission's director. The Mission has 15 village churches which they care for and preaching stations. Seven congregations meet in churches erected with the help of the mission while others meet under the trees.

CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH OF MAYANMAR

From Rev. Sa Do: Due to the political crisis in Myanmar, the Congregational Church of Myanmar Mission has been faced with many unspeakable difficulties which include finances, safety for the workers and mission property, as well as safety for the Grace Children. We are living under the military ruling of martial law. Due to daily demonstrations in Yangon, no one has been able to go outside for work since February. Our small church is a safeguard for some mission



families who have no safety and no food. We are feeding 25-30 members daily. As Myanmar Mission efforts are being served by indigenous missionaries, most are from Chin State. Over 30 Missionaries have gone back to their native land for security reasons. Our Okkan Pastor and his family also moved to a safer place for a while.

The mission needs relief efforts, sponsorship of Grace children, and five mission workers' support. Please pray for our mission families and needs.

Grace Children's Ministry provides free education and care for needy and orphan children with the Ministry including Gospel Outreach programs, Sunday School and Summer gospel activities. CCM has pre-Primary School with two full-time teachers and two part-time teachers. CCM also has the Grace Children's Home in Yangon where the children attend government schools but the Church provides food and clothing, welfare and care.

The stated values of our country, when lived out in ways that match our higher faith values, are worth doing! So being a community member who looks out for the wellbeing of our neighbors is worth doing. Being a person of justice that seeks to understand the situations of those less fortunate and mistreated is worth doing. Living with a sense of freedom while also being responsible to not hurt others is worth doing. Being humble and caring enough to listen to others about their life experiences and even their different opinions is worth doing. Being informed, even when it has become more difficult to discern between sensationalist opinions and reliable news is worth doing. Honoring what God has created and working to let this amazing place still be habitable to future generations is worth doing. Exercising our faith, believing that God can use us and work all things out for good is also worth doing!

Not too long ago I was listening to a public radio station and heard a man named Eric Liu who started something called Citizen University which attempts to help people become better citizens and wrote a book called Become America; Civic Sermons on Love, Responsibility and Democracy. I thought it was very interesting, bought his book and read portions of it. Liu tells about a community group he and his wife helped get started that made up a pledge which goes, "I pledge to be an active American. To show up for others, To govern myself, To help govern my community. I commit myself to my country's creed: To cherish liberty as a responsibility. I pledge to serve and to push my country: When right, to be kept right; when wrong, to be set right. Wherever my ancestors and I were born, I claim America And I pledge to live like a citizen."

In reading this I thought, "This is the type of patriotism that could coexist with living out one's faith in God and Christ."

As you celebrate the 4th of July I encourage you to consider what it means to be a good citizen of this country and pray God will help all of us learn to be good citizens of heaven while here on earth.
