He and his wife have lived in Southeast Asia since 2008. They lived in Vietnam for five years working with the underground church, helping to install water purification systems in the Mekong Delta. From 2013 to 2020 they lived in Northern Thailand and Myanmar. They are currently preparing to return to Southeast Asia in early 2022.



We were reassigned a men's home that is part of Grandma's House of Hope (a Grandpa's House). It was nice to have help as soon as we arrived! One man picked the tree up out of the bed of the truck and carried it into the house and another jumped to help Carol clear space to decorate in the kitchen. The men seemed to appreciate the Christmas décor. Thank you to all who donated!







Grandma's House of Hope exists to empower the invisible populations of Orange County. One of their programs is Rescued & Restored Housing through which they provide safe, confidential, emergency and transitional shelter/housing for those who are experiencing homelessness and in need of trauma informed care and support.

Sabah is blind and has less than 10 percent of her hearing. She lives alone on the top of the Mount of Olives. On Sundays, using her cane, she walks up the little alley from her home to the street. There we find her patiently waiting for us to pick her up for church. During worship service, she always asks when the offering will occur so she can put in her shekels. She likes to have someone sit next to her during worship. As Karen leads singing, I sometimes have the honor to do so. Sabah is from a Muslim family, but many years ago began to follow Jesus. She is one of the humble people in Jerusalem who is dear to the heart of Jesus. This is the joy of serving here - knowing the sincere brothers and sisters who love the Lord.
