

"Sending Aid to Ukraine - Trusting God in the Wilderness"

It's tough to trust in God's faithfulness at times. I received a message from a friend of mine who married Elena, a woman from Ukraine a few years ago. He writes, "Elena got up this morning to see videos of the city where she lived being shelled, her apartment in the picture and people from her neighborhood dead on the ground. Almost hysterical, it took me a while to calm her down. I couldn't get her away from the computer, she took the day off her work, she continues to look for the victories of her people (there are many), these are the only things holding her together for now.

Nobody expected the blitzkrieg/war to last more than a day, but it has lasted 5 days so far and Russia so far is no closer to their goals than day 1. Yes we are hoping/praying that Russia surrenders unconditionally, even Putin's own people are beginning to understand he is mad. Many of the Russian soldiers have already surrendered, they say they did not know they were being sent to Ukraine until they were already there and don't want any part of it."

These are very difficult times for the people of Ukraine. But it's in the wilderness when the trail is hard to follow that we learn to trust God. Jesus reminds his hearers in Luke 10:27, "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength; and with all your mind; and your neighbor as yourself." During this Lenten season as a church, we are collecting funds to help refugees fleeing Ukraine into neighboring countries. Send your check to FCCA and mark it "Ukraine." We will send these funds to a reputable Christian organization currently working with refugees. It is a privilege to help those in need as we try to love our neighbor as our self.



Season of Lent

Ash Wednesday (March 2nd) to Easter Sunday

It was good to begin the Lenten Season with a time of prayer and reflection in the Griffith House Chapel. Lent is the season between Ash Wednesday and Easter. It is 40 days (not counting Sundays) that is observed in remembrance of the 40 days that Jesus fasted and prayed in the wilderness before the start of his ministry. It is 40 days when the church is invited to fast and prepare for Easter, when we celebrate that Jesus is risen! Some individuals choose to give something up (fast) during the season of Lent. Fasting from something like coffee, dessert, television or social media may serve as a reminder that our life ultimately comes from God. It may also serve as a reminder to take time each day to pray, study the Bible, read a devotional or be intentional about our relationship with God and neighbor in a meaningful way.



Missions Corner

One of our local missions, Grandma's House of Hope, has sent out a plea for help. One of their programs is called NANA'S KIDZ. Since 2007, this program has been providing healthy meals to children and families living in motels, low-income housing or experiencing homelessness, on weekends and during school breaks. Many kids rely heavily on school cafeterias for their primary source of nutritional food, therefore they struggle on non-school days. This is a critical need as children, particularly teens, are likely to hide their hunger rather than face public embarrassment. Since COVID-19, the need has skyrocketed. They now find their pantry bare and basic food items are needed. Your Mission Board will have a box outside the sanctuary starting March 6th to collect donations throughout the month of March. Please bring whatever you can to help us fill the box and help replenish the NANA'S KIDZ pantry.



Nana's Kidz Urgent Food Drive

More than 20 percent of children living in Orange County – roughly **153,490 kids – are living in households that are considered "food insecure**." 49% are eligible to receive free or reduced-price school meals. Many times, these children go to bed or to school hungry. Our Nana's Kidz Food Distribution program helps lift that burden for 3,500 children each year.
