If life becomes unlivable, they leave. In the last year, two hundred Christian families left Bethelhem. We conveyed that if the Christian community collapses entirely, it will be chaos in Palestinian society. So, we are doing what we can to raise awareness of the Palestinian Christian plight.

We are in a ministry phase called 'itinerant missionaries' in missions' lingo. We have a home in Pennsylvania near family, but we are more than fully engaged in our mission in Israel/Palestine, the Philippines, and the US.

Also, whether in the States or overseas, our snail mail newsletters will always be sent from within the US. Our last newsletter from Jerusalem was in June because the price of one Israeli airmail stamp to the US has increased to \$4.00!

Thank you for your partnership in the Lord's work and our call to make Christ's servanthood known to all. Your love and faithfulness have sustained us. With love always-

This is my first opportunity to include it in The Call. Some recent updates and information about the ongoing conflict in Gaza, and how it even affects Christians in the area, are included. I think you will find it quite interesting. We need to continue to pray for this conflict to be resolved.

Dear Friends,

Palm Sunday is a good time to praise the Lord this coming Sunday. Despite the difficulties of our times, there are successes along the way.



Our work in the Middle East is multifaceted. We continue to pastor the online congregation of the East Jerusalem International Church, lead their weekly international online service, offer administrative help to the church, and more. (We receive no financial reimbursement from the church.) Our online congregation comprises people with some linkage to the church or Bethlehem Bible College. During the war, this has been important support to those who struggled to have hope for a better day. We pray together every Saturday.

We are trying to stand with the six-hundred Christians in Gaza who remain sheltered in the two historic churches. It has been a blessing to be a conduit of help to Gazan friends we know, such as Shady and

Ghada Najar, who have escaped that catastrophe. The way out has been closed for months now. We are so glad our friends got out when they could. Many churches are surprised to learn that there are Christians in Gaza.

Then, in the Palestinian Territories, we continue to help lead people into a deeper understanding of peacemaking, encourage the local Christians by walking by their side, and more. We will travel to Bethlehem in May to lead a two-week training course.

In the States, we continue to speak widely and often. On Thursday, April 3, Karen and I visited Speaker of the House Mike Johnson's office in the Capitol Building to confer with his staff about the distress of the Palestinian Christians. Even though Palestinian Christians comprise only 1% of the population on the West Bank, they have a much more significant role than that would convey. Through churches, hospitals, schools, NGOs, and businesses, Palestinian Christians employ almost one third of the people on the West Bank.
