A Letter from Penny Schibsted

Today I read some interesting things about Easter. Easter is celebrated on different days different years because it is the first Sunday after the first full moon following the spring equinox. Did you know that? Well now you do!

It is interesting how the holiday of Easter got started. Celebrations of the spring equinox were already occurring in many cultures, especially ones north of the equator where getting a little more daylight was so desired! Such celebrations were going on long before Jesus was on earth and when Christianity was introduced in these places it worked out to celebrate his resurrection along with the celebrations of Spring.

Pastor Jim and I were fortunate to visit Ireland prior to an International Congregational Fellowship meeting in England back in 2013. There we took a tour with a wonderful guide who explained why celebrations of the spring equinox and summer solstice were so important in Ireland. The growing season for plants was short, and to survive communities needed enough sunshine. The beginning of spring when plants could possibly begin to grow food was a life or death matter. Summer solstice, when daylight is longest, was also cherished and celebrated.

On our tour we went to a place called New Grange; a remarkable large structure built 500 years before the Egyptian pyramids! It was built in such a way that sunlight fills the place for 4 days only, right at the winter solstice! Various sites built around the summer or winter solstice are all over Ireland and show how important sunlight and cycles of nature were to these people. *(Continued on Page 7)*

Missions' Corner: An Update From Linda Freud, Mission Chair

Last month I highlighted one of our oldest supported international missions, Mission Ministries Philippines. This month I will highlight one of our newest supported local missions, Grandma's House of Hope.

Grandma's House of Hope has offered essential housing, food and support to thousands of children, adults and families in Orange County over the last 18 years. In 2004, Je'net Kreitner's strong faith led her to open up her own home to provide



emergency shelter for women experiencing trauma and abuse. Since then, the mission has continually expanded programs to bring even deeper healing to the community and to empower the invisible populations of Orange County. In 2022 they housed 291 participants in the Rescued and Restored housing progam, provided 319,000 meals to hungry children and familes in their Nana's Kidz program, and supported 50 at risk children each month with after school enrichment in their Hope Works! program.

The last three years of the COVID pandemic and its aftermath have been devastating for individuals and families in the community. These years have also been financially challenging for Grandma's House of Hope, as community needs have grown while available funding sources have diminished. As a result, **Grandma's House of Hope Board has made the heart-wrenching decision to scale back** their programming due to budgetary constraints. They will concentrate their resources on the **Rescued and Restored Housing Program, which is their largest program. This requires pausing both Nana's Kidz Hunger Prevention Program and Hope Works! Education and Enrichment Program.**

As they move forward, they will work to renew existing funding, cultivate new sources of funding, strengthen their staff and Board, nurture new community partnerships and build a strong foundation for the future. They hope to restart the Nana's Kidz Program in the future, though they don't have a specific timeline mapped out at this point. This is a big change, but the Board is deeply committed to Grandma's House of Hope and its mission. They are optimistic for the future and thank everyone for continued support as they work through this difficult transition.



On our Ireland tour we also heard about and were able to actually see the Book of Kells at Trinity College in Dublin. The Book of Kells is

an illuminated manuscript of the four gospels of the Christian New Testament that dates back to 800 AD. The illustrations are beautiful and were likely very meaningful to the masses of people who couldn't read but who could understand a good



story with pictures. The pictures made use of light and growing plants while also telling the gospel.
