Anticipating Easter - Rev. Emily Raasch



Thank you all for your prayers and support during my pregnancy. It is hard to believe that the due date is rapidly approaching! Imagining our son's presence in the world provides comfort as we also face the anxieties that come with delivery and new parenthood. Jesus reminded the disciples of this time in a woman's life as he prepared the disciples for his death and resurrection:

196 [Jesus] said to them, "Are you asking one another what I meant when I said, In a little while you will see me no more, and then after a little while you will see me? 20 Very truly I tell you, you will weep and mourn while the world rejoices. You will grieve, but your grief will turn to joy. 21 A woman giving birth to a child has pain because her time has come; but when her baby is born she forgets the anguish because of her joy that a child is born into the world. 22 So with you: Now is your time of grief, but I will see you again and you will rejoice, and no one will take away your joy. John 16:19b-22

The joy of Easter comes with the grief of the cross. In our church small group study, we have spent time contemplating the last 24 hours of Jesus' life. It is gut-wrenching to consider the rejection and torture Jesus faced. It reminds me that sin is a powerful force that works against life. Missions Corner

Your Mission Board met at the beginning of March to discuss two important issues. One was the "One Great

Hour of Sharing" campaign for California Fire Relief. Your generous donations totaled \$1,217. We rounded that up to \$1,300 and sent it off to the National Association.

Second was to review and discuss the facts and figures that



Mike Villa Real shared with all of us one Sunday after he returned from his trip to the Philippines. He had asked Dr. Chona Domingo, the director, what was the greatest need of Mission Ministries Philippines. She



shared that the dream of MMP is to help 2,000 children to become fluent readers with 2,000 reading books, training and coaching for teachers, and a reading center at each school. This included the MMP supported schools and some public schools. We looked at the possibility of only helping the MMP supported schools which would be 1,000 students. The costs for that is \$8,000 for reading books, \$450 for teacher training, \$2,160 for on-going coaching of the teachers, and \$360 for a reading center in each school. This totaled \$10,970 which we realized is not something that can happen all at once, but that it can be a long term goal. Those of you who met Chona when she visited us two years ago, know she is a woman of great faith and believes

that God will provide. She is an amazing person who runs this mission with a team of only five. Mike was so impressed with their dedication and devotion.

We looked at donations that were contributed by you for Mike's trip. He took a check for \$1,632. How he distributed this money was included in the Annual Mission Report that you received in February. But more money designated for MMP has been received since his trip, which totals \$1,115. The mission board will add \$500 so that \$1,615 can be sent to MMP as a starting point for their ultimate goal. Throughout this year

of 2025 we will ask that you prayerfully consider how you can help. Any donation of any amount at any time can be made with MMP written in the memo line or on the offering envelope. We, like Chona, have great faith that God can do great things.

Lastly, I am sharing some pictures and info about another one of our supported missions, "Christ to the Villages" in Nigeria. This is the mission run by Rev. Matthew Oladele, who has visited our church in the past.
