Watching for Signs of God

This Christmas season, my husband and I had the privilege of witnessing a Holy moment. We drove to Tijuana to help the staff of the Panamerican Institute with their annual Christmas food basket giveaway. Students are typically fed during the school day, so the Christmas break can be particularly hard on families. Laura Ramirez (PAI President) had told me about a new family at the school. They fled their home for their safety and arrived in Tijuana with only the clothes on their back. The school welcomed the children and offered financial support for their uniforms.

(not pictured) arrived
to pick up their
Christmas food basket, I did not know
that they were the
same family Laura
had told me about.
On their way out the
door, Laura stopped
them and quietly ex-



plained a separate gift for them from a sponsor. The sponsor had given \$20 per child so that they could have something for Christmas. My husband and I could not understand what was being said in Spanish, but we could feel the emotion in the room. The mother and a couple of the oldest children were overcome with emotion, and tears welled in their eyes. I suddenly realized who the family may be. Ricky and I were both in tears as we experienced the tangible gratitude and the love in the room. I thought, this is what it feels like when God's love is shared in the world. (Continued on Page 7)


Dear Friends -

(Watching for Signs of God, Continued...)

The 12 days of Christmas follow December 25th and lead us to Epiphany on January 6th, when we remember the wise men who followed a star in order to meet the Messiah, the king of the Jews. They were watching for signs of God in the world around them. Their interior longing to encounter God led them to watch for signs of God and to respond to those signs with action. They made a long commute by camel from the East to Jerusalem in hopes of meeting Jesus. They had no guarantees, but they moved forward in faith.

Is there a longing in our hearts to know God more? I believe that stirring from within is in itself a gift from God as God calls us to himself. We were designed for connection with each other and with our Maker. That longing leads us to greater attention. How have you noticed God's love reaching out to you through signs in the world? Are there ways that God is calling you to move forward in faith as a response to what you have observed or experienced? We may not have camels, but interior longing, watchfulness and faith continue to call us, like the wise men, into the unknown as we notice the signs and the leading of God.

My prayer for our church this New Year is that we would continue to have a deep longing to notice God, to partner with God. I pray that we would be watchful and that God would give us signs of His calling. May we have courageous faith like the wise men that is willing to respond without guarantees.
