(Article Continued) Lots of apples were brought ahead of time where they were stacked in one family's garage. Stations were set up for the cider making process. Two wheel barrels were next to a hose for washing, one big table with cutting boards was near the washing station. Prepped apples were then taken to the grinding machine. Finally, there was the old apple press and it was constantly going. People standing by it knew exactly what to do and once a batch was done being pressed a man quickly gathered the net holding the left over apple scraps and ran them to his compost bin then returned the net. The full cider catching bucket was quickly exchanged for an empty one and transported to the pouring station where containers were filled. Some were taken home by guests that day. Others were taken to the church freezer where the juice will be enjoyed at gatherings for most of 2024.

What impressed me with this process was 40+ people were laughing, talking and enjoying their time together while also working efficiently on a common goal in a beautiful outdoor setting. They were giving thanks to God for the fruit of the land and for each other.

On Sunday, November 19th we at First Congregational Church of Anaheim will have our own experience of gathering together, giving thanks and enjoying a wonderful meal. There will be people from different churches on our campus sharing ethnic foods they have prepared while we share roasted turkey and mashed potatoes. It is always a special time and will be even more special if you are there with us! Please come and invite a guest. There will be a bounce house for the children.

May God help us all to live in the balance between prayerful action and gratitude this Thanksgiving season.
